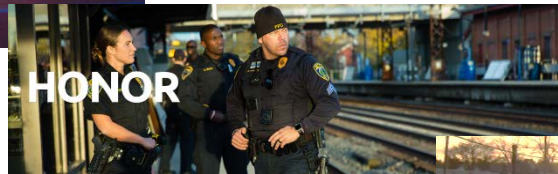

**COMMENTS**

On 6/11/20 Sergeant Irizarry heard a broadcast from Norwalk P.D. that a shooting had just occurred in their town and the victim was shot twice in the abdomen. SGT. Irizarry immediately notified Fairfield Dispatch and provided them the information which included the shooting information, a description of the suspect's car and its occupancy of four men. He coordinate patrol having them observe all exit ramps.

Detective Nadeau and Detective Buckmir observed the suspect's car driving recklessly N/B on I95. The vehicle exited the highway in our town and it was picked up by Off. Bennett and Off. Letsch who then pursued the vehicle East bound with Sergeant Irizarry as he had reengaged in the pursuit. The vehicle continued into the city of Bridgeport where Officer Jenkins engaged and took over as the secondary Officer calling out direction and speed.

The Pursuit concluded when the operator of the fleeing vehicle bailed out and ran into Central High school. Off. Letsch secured the suspect's vehicle as a perimeter was coordinated by SGT. Irizarry and Bridgeport Officers. The Suspect was flushed out of the school and was captured without incident or injuries.

SGT. Irizarry detailed Officer Beatie and Field Training Officer Chris M Rubis to retrace the pursuit in order to look for evidence. As they retraced the pursuit route, Off. Beatie and Off. Rubis located a gun in the middle of Kings highway near Villa Avenue. The gun was secured and picked up as evidence by Norwalk PD. The suspected was transported to Fairfield Lock up and interviewed by Norwalk Detectives where they were able to obtain a confession from the suspect!!

During the pursuit Dispatcher Lynn Erasmus was the police dispatcher. She was calm, professional, and efficient the entire time. She coordinating our personnel and outside agencies. Her clear and precise directions and answers no doubt played a large part in keeping the incident controlled and safe. which led to the capture of a violent Felon.

On 6/9/20 Officer C M. Rubis and his F.T.O. Officer Fuller were assigned to a C.F.S. 20-21264 of an adult male who is currently attempting to kill himself. The complainant, (wife) is currently arguing with her husband over the fact that he wants to kill himself. Prior to arrival, the husband had already run out of the house making statements to end his life, and that he wanted to do it on I95.

While the call was in progress multiple patrols including Detective Dalling, Sergeant Irizarry, Crash Investigator M. Letsch were actively looking for the suicidal subject.

Officer Chase located the Subject near I95 near exit 24, when He attempted to make contact the subject ran away onto I95 with medium to heavy traffic. Officer Chase, Officer Beatie, Officer Fuller, Officer C M. Rubis, Sergeant Irizarry, Detective Dalling all gave chase on foot onto the highway in attempt to subdue the subject. Officer Beating was able to catch up to the subject and physically stop him from running. The subject continued to actively resist and all other personnel on the highway assisted Officer Beatie taking the subject into protective custody.

There were no major injuries to the suicidal subject besides some minor scratches. Great team effort by all involved and who volunteered to assist!

The individuals who located, and gave chase to the suicidal subject onto I95 risked their own lives to save a life of another and should be recognized for their great police work!!!

On July 2, 2020 at approximately 1357 hours, Officer Gonzalez responded to the report of a subject who collapsed and became unresponsive while riding his stationary bicycle in the basement of his home.

Upon arrival at the scene Officer Gonzalez entered the basement of the home and found the subject laying on the floor while the wife was performing chest compressions on him. Officer Gonzalez immediately intervened and took over chest compressions while Fire Department personnel prepared the Lucas Chest Compression System.

Fire Department personnel administered two shocks to the subject with the AED machine prior to deploying the Lucas Chest Compression System. The subject was then transported to St. Vincent's Hospital.

A follow-up of the man's condition on July 10, 2020 revealed that although he has not yet been discharged from the hospital, he is alert and in stable condition.

Officer Gonzalez should be commended for his life saving efforts.

On July 2, 2020 at approximately 1324 hours Officer Guilfoyle responded to the report of a male laying on the ground in the parking lot of Andros Diner.

Upon arrival Officer Guilfoyle determined the man was not breathing and did not have a pulse. As a result, Officer Guilfoyle immediately began chest compressions. After several rounds of chest compressions the man began to gasp for air and Officer Guilfoyle was able to detect a faint pulse.

While Officer Guilfoyle continued with chest compressions, Fire Department and AMR personnel arrived on scene and assisted by deploying the AED machine and administering two shocks to the subject. The man was then transported to St. Vincent's Hospital for further treatment.

A follow-up of the man's condition revealed that he was discharged from the hospital three days later on July 5, 2020.

Officer Guilfoyle should be commended for his quick actions and life saving efforts.

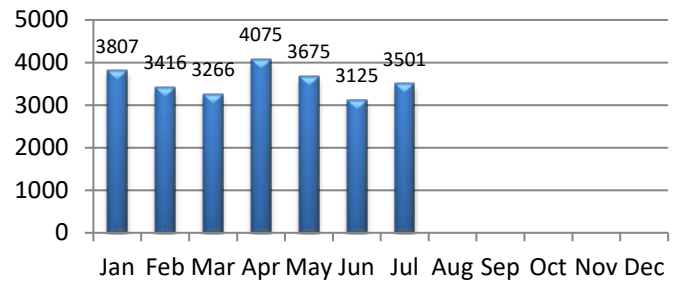

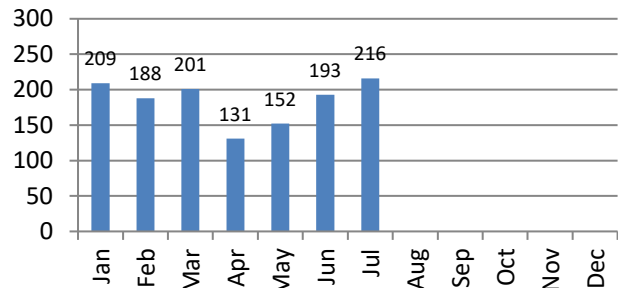

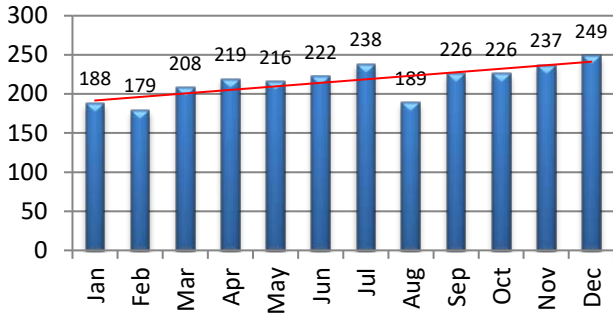

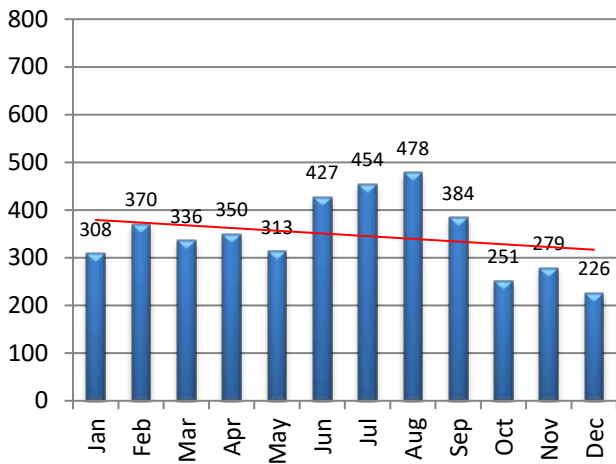

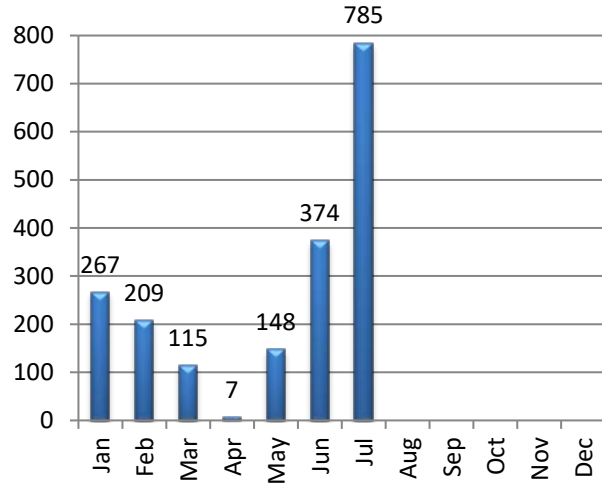

Parking Tags Issued 2019



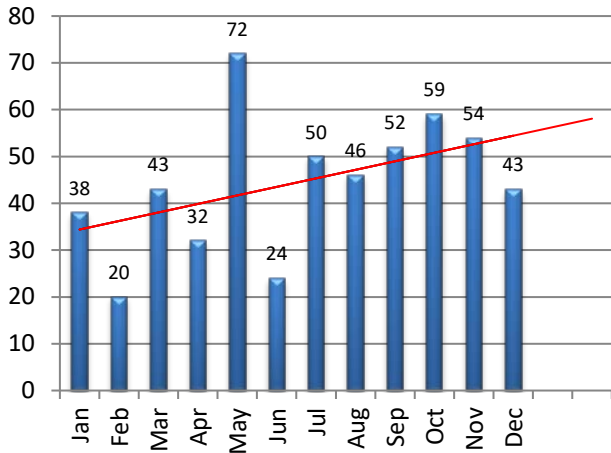
Parking Tags Issued - 2020



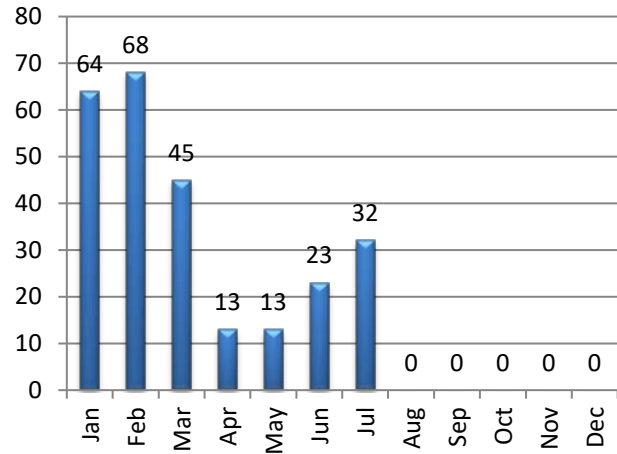
