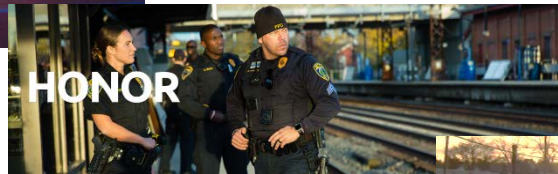

(Name removed) has Smith-Magenis Syndrome which is also an autism spectrum disorder. I appreciate the assistance you gave me in getting her out of the store safely and discreetly through the back door into my car in order for me to get her home. Unfortunately, I never got all the officers names but would like you to relay this message of appreciation. I am working with DDS and a Kennedy Center behaviorist to ensure more measures are in place to prevent such an incident. I apologize for any inconvenience and especially for the officer that got punched in the head. I am well aware that such incidents can escalate but I was glad it ended as smoothly as possible.

March 27, 2021 FPF File 21-12163

ECC received a report of a BMW driving recklessly on the Post Road at a high rate of speed and passing cars. Officer C.M. Rubis located the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop on Sanford Street. As Officer Rubis exited his car the BMW fled the stop at a high rate of speed. No pursuit was initiated. The operator was later located at his residence in Shelton and charged with multiple motor vehicle violations.

March 27, 2021 FPD File 21-12177

This incident started as a Bridgeport Police Hotline broadcast at 23:09 hours informing us that they were in pursuit of a Nissan Maxima that was wanted for a “shots fired” incident in Bridgeport. Fairfield officers assisted with the pursuit and Officer Gorton and Officer Fenton were able to successfully deploy spike strips, resulting in the apprehension of three suspects.

March 27, 2021

At approximately 17:25 hours ECC received a report of a large group of ATVs and dirt bikes driving recklessly down the Post Road. Officers monitored the situation, but due to the high risk of further reckless behavior and operation known to occur when police attempt to stop these operators, no enforcement action was attempted.

March 30, 2021 FPD 21-12453

On 03/30/2021, at approximately 0012hrs, the Fairfield Police Emergency Communications Center received several 911 calls reporting a collision at the intersection of Black Rock Turnpike at Commerce Drive.

An on-scene investigation revealed that Vehicle #1 (2006 Chrysler 300) was traveling west on Commerce Drive through a flashing red traffic signal, when it struck the passenger side of Vehicle #2 (2014 Toyota Camry) which was traveling north on Black Rock Tnpk. The force of the collision pushed Vehicle #2 into an Aquarion Water fire hydrant and a traffic light pole support.

The passenger in Vehicle #1, a Bridgeport resident, suffered severe injury to her lower extremities as a result of this collision and was transported to Bridgeport Hospital for treatment. She was listed in stable condition at the hospital. Operator #1, was transported to Saint Vincent's Medical Center, with a minor head injury. Operator #2, a Bridgeport resident was transported to Saint Vincent's Medical Center, with a minor head injury and lacerations to his arms and hands. He was conscious and alert speaking to investigators. He is listed in stable condition in Bridgeport Hospital.

This crash is under investigation by the Fairfield Police Crash Reconstruction Unit.



March 31, 2021 FPF File: 21-12615

Patrols responded to a motor vehicle accident on Hoydens Hill Road where a vehicle drove off the roadway. The female operator was trapped in the vehicle and suffered a possible broken ankle. The crash is under investigation as a possible DUI.

They had lost sight of the vehicle around exit 26 southbound. A few moments later, you observed a vehicle with their lights off, traveling on I-95 at a high rate of speed on the Mill Plain Road overpass. You further witnessed a single State Trooper initiating a pursuit behind the suspects. You decided to provide back-up for safety to the trooper, where you were able to maintain normal speeds and advise dispatch as to the location of the suspect vehicle. The vehicle exited at exit 14 in Norwalk and re-entered the highway northbound. Short time later, Officer Gorton was able to successfully initiate the first spike strip at exit 22 southbound as the suspects exited in our town, before re-entering the highway northbound. 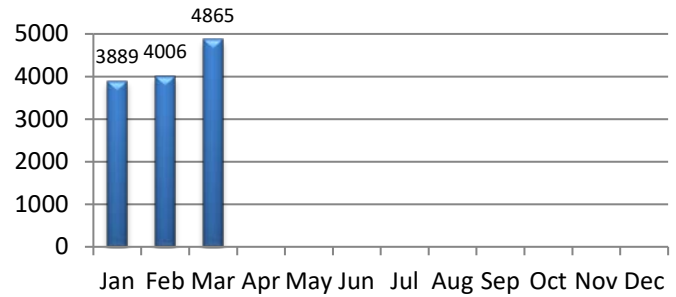

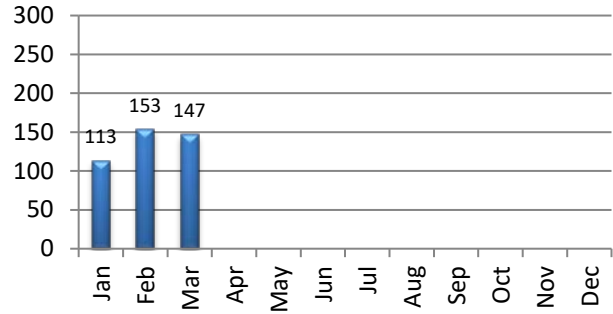

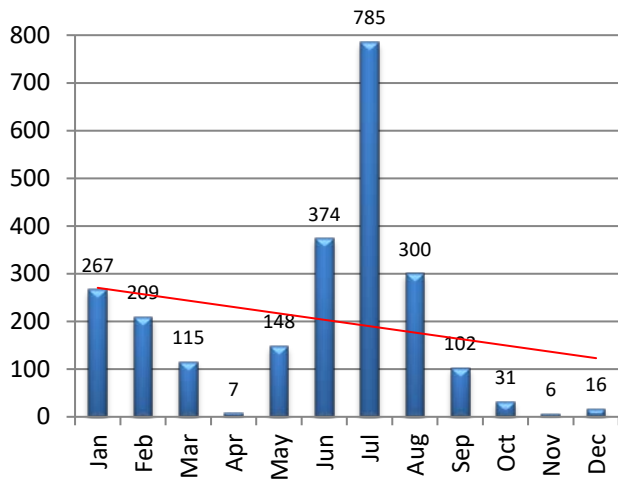

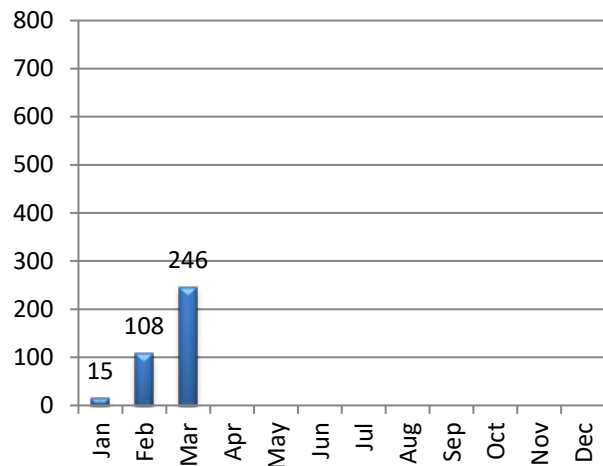

Parking Tags Issued 2020



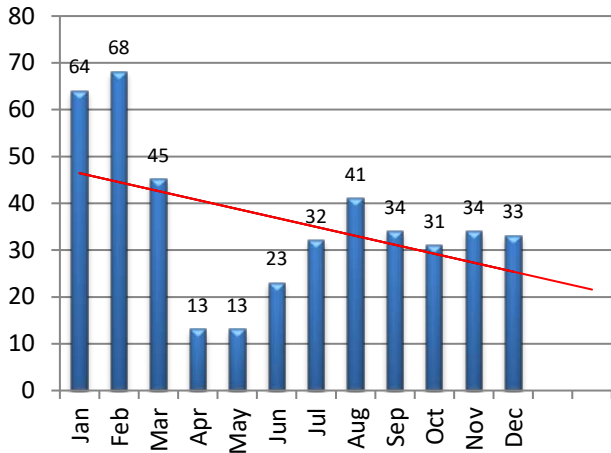
Parking Tags Issued - 2021



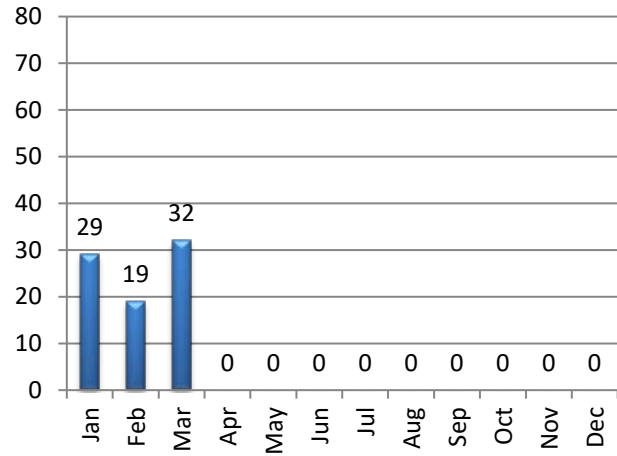
