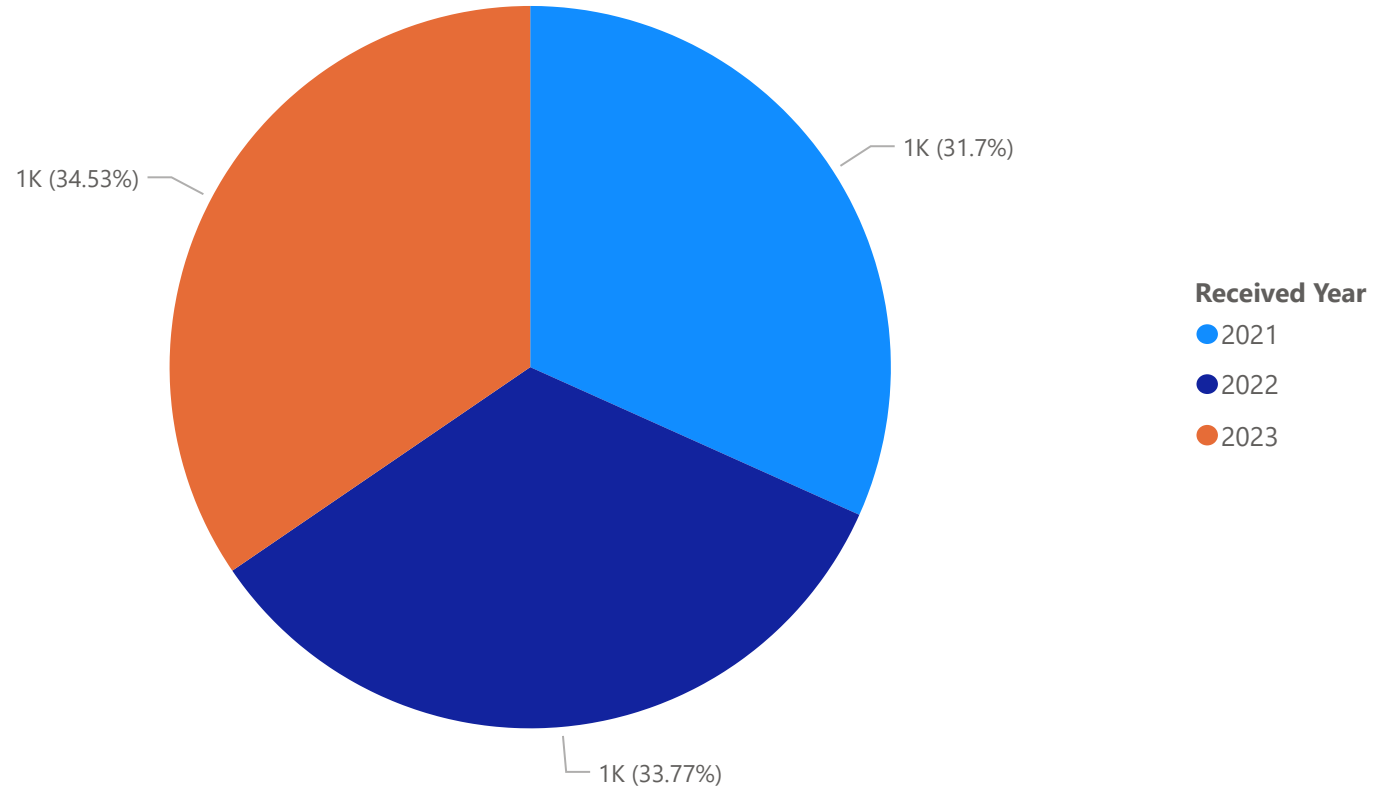

Incident Reporting Count by Received Year

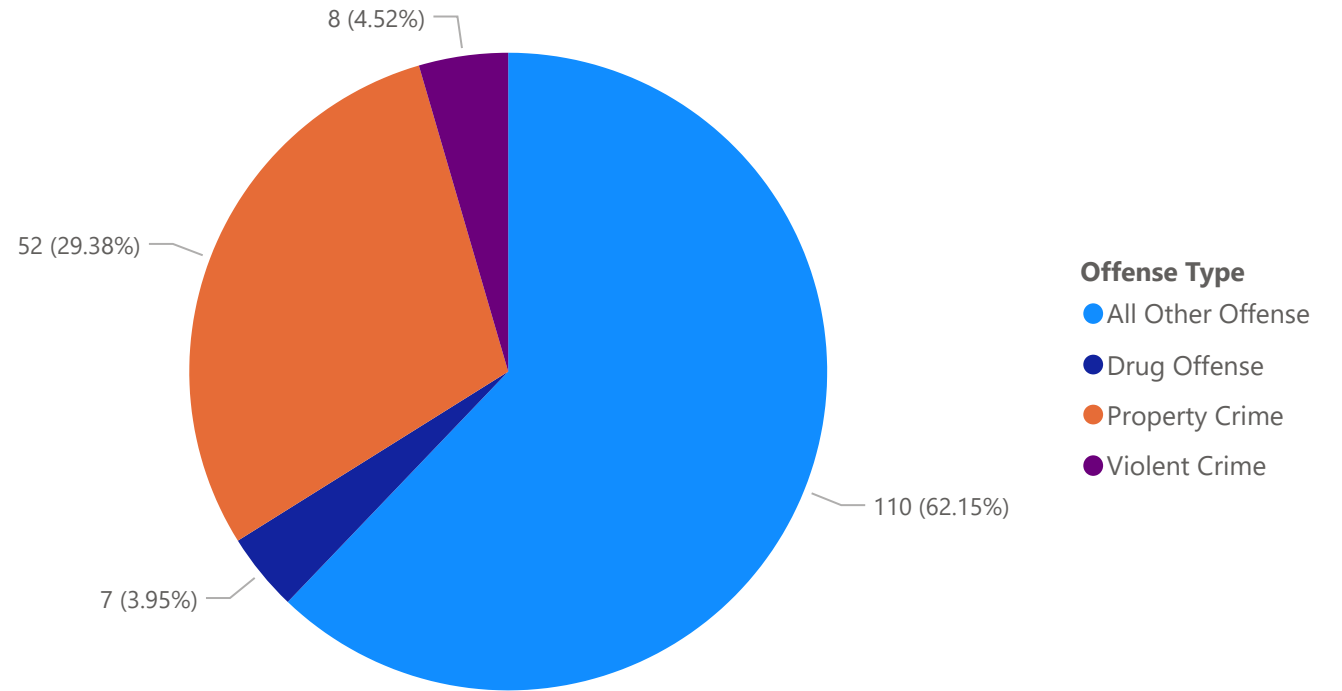

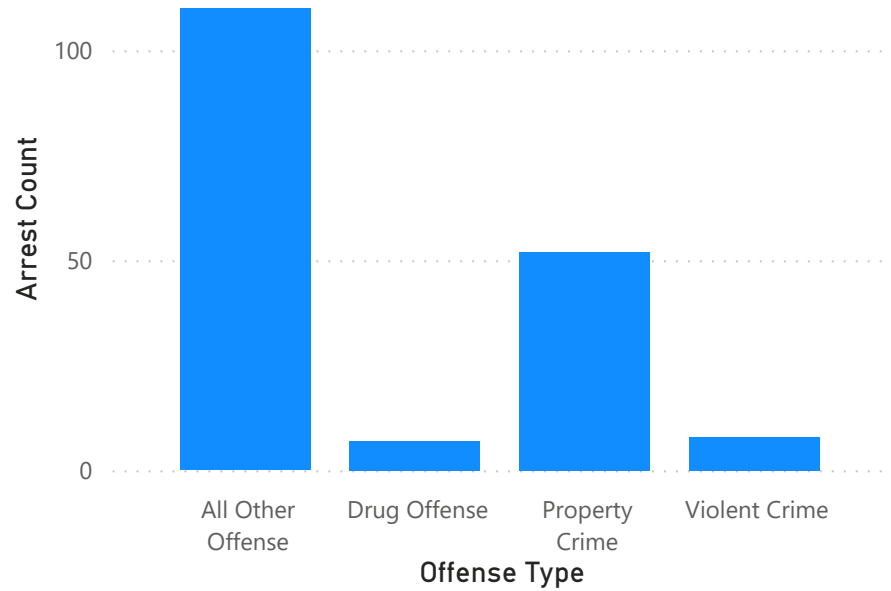

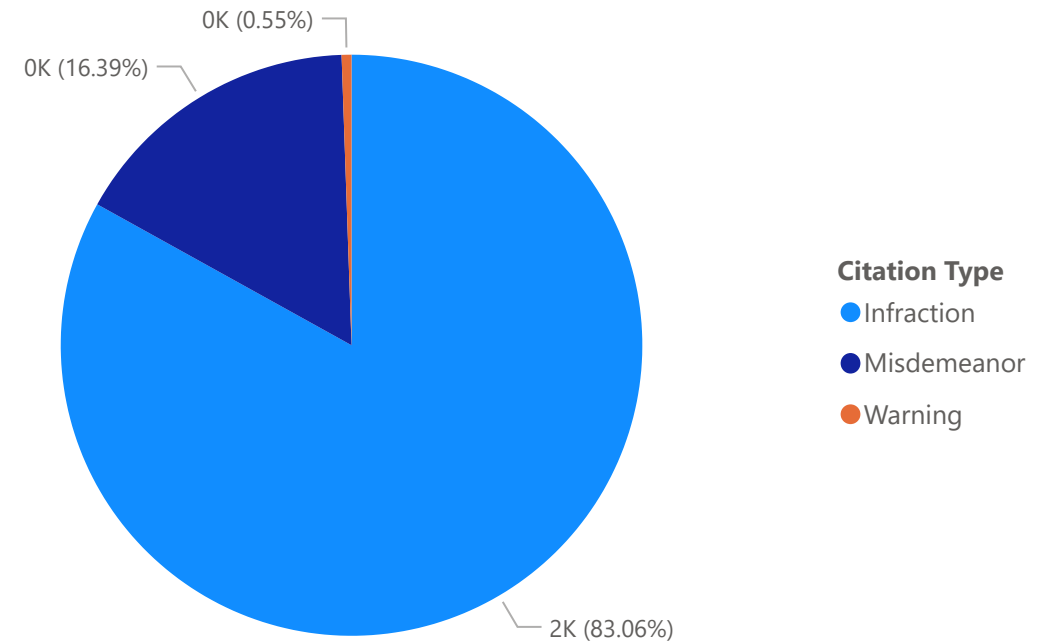

Total Citations and Fine Amount by Citation Year



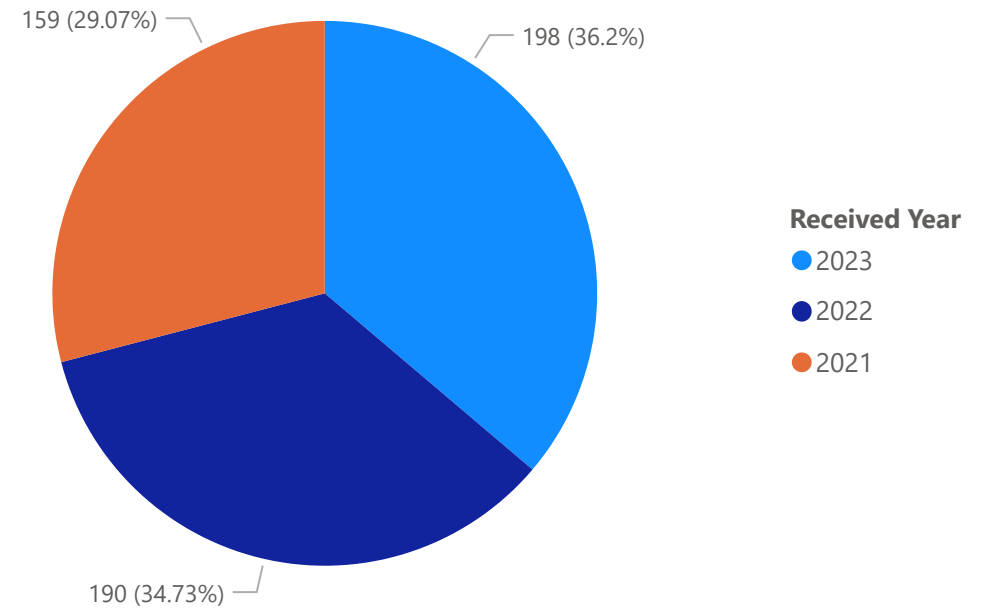
Total Citations by Citation Year

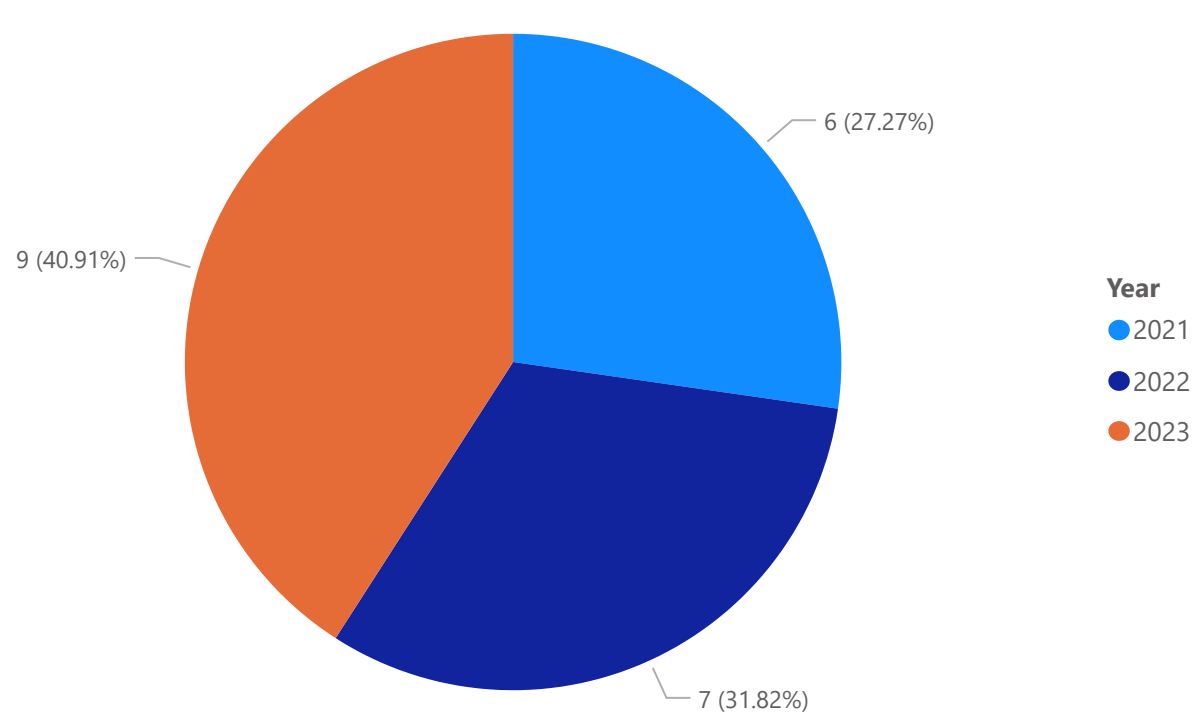
Incident Reporting Count by Received Year
