### Noteworthy Police Work

#### **Supervisor Report of Noteworthy Police Work: 16-23486**

They were able to force entry into the home, locate the victim and assist with medical care. The woman survived the incident.

#### **Supervisor Report of Noteworthy Police Work: 16-24406**

Lt. Bloch recognized Officer Rubis, Sergeant Riendeau, Officer Kaesmann and Maverick for their apprehension of a subject suspected of attempting to commit a theft of wheels from cars in an auto dealership lot.

#### **Supervisor Report of Noteworthy Police Work: 16-25151**

Sergeant Nook recognized Officer Bennett and Officer Jenkins for their actions when dealing with a subject suffering from a psychological disorder. The person ran from a motor vehicle accident, was only wearing underwear, attempted to enter other vehicles and then fought with officers as they attempted to restrain him. Their actions prevented potential harm to the subject or others.

#### **Supervisor Report of Noteworthy Police Work: 16-25913**

Sgt. Paris recognized Officer Jeffrey Wikman for his arrest of a subject who was in possession of marijuana, cocaine and drug paraphernalia. Officer Wikman had stopped the subject for a seatbelt violation and through his observations and investigation located the illegal items in the vehicle.

## Message of Thanks

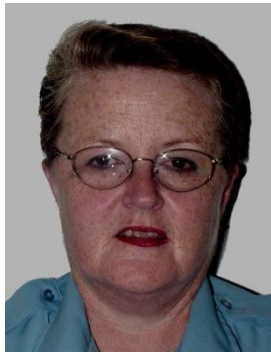
